

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPROVED COMMISSARIES

A commissary is defined as a permitted fixed food establishment that serves as an operating base for a mobile food vehicle. The commissary is where the vehicle will be stored, parked, serviced, cleaned, supplied, and maintained. **Home based operations are not allowed.**

All mobile food vehicles must report daily to a commissary where:

- The vehicle is properly cleaned and serviced.
- All food contact surfaces are washed, rinsed, and sanitized.
- The liquid waste is properly disposed.
- The vehicle receives potable water necessary to operate.
- Food served from the vehicle is stored, handled, or prepared.
- Single service articles are properly stored.
- The vehicle is stored overnight.

Out-of-town commissaries must submit a copy of the current local health permit and a copy of the last health inspection report conducted by the local health authority.

Note: If you do not own your own commissary, you must secure a Town of Cross Roads Commissary Approval Form and have it filled out completely by the commissary owner. It must be signed by the commissary owner and notarized if the commissary owner is not present at our office at the time of signing.
