IN REMEMBRANCE OF OFFICER BARDWELL

This year is the 2nd anniversary of the late Cross Roads PD officer Chris Bardwell's death. Officer Bardwell passed on February 1st, 2022 as a result of complications after contracting COVID-19.

Officer Bardwell served the Cross Roads Police Department since its inception in September 2021. Officer Bardwell was a valuable member of Cross Roads team and dedicated to the professional service of the community.

Prior to coming to Cross Roads, Officer Bardwell served the North Texas community in two other cities. He spent five years with the Celina Police Department and twentythree years with the Grand Prairie Police Department.

In April of 2023, Officer Bardwell was memorialized by the State of Texas at the Texas Peace Officers' Memorial in Austin, Texas.

In May of 2023, he was memorialized nationally at the National Peace Officers' Memorial in Washington D.C. along with other fallen officers from all across the nation.

Officer Bardwell was one of the first officers to join the force and the PD will always remember the tremendous impact he had not only within the department but also within the Cross Roads Community.

Cross Roads thanks Officer Bardwell for his service, and our hearts and prayers go out to his family.



HAPPY RANDOM ACT OF KINDNESS DAY!

Random Act of Kindness Day takes place on February 7th this year! What is Random Act of Kindness Day, you may ask?

Random Act of Kindness Day is an annual day to celebrate and encourage random acts of kindness. The first Random Act of Kindness Day was celebrated in New Zealand in 2004 and has been celebrated annually for the last 10 years.

Promoters of the day suggest paying for another person's meal in drive-thrus, letting someone go ahead in line, buying extra at the grocery store and donating it to a food pantry, buying flowers for someone, helping someone change a flat tire, posting anonymous sticky notes with validating or uplifting messages around for people to find, complimenting a colleague on their work, sending an encouraging text to someone, taking muffins to work, letting a car into the traffic ahead of you, washing someone else's car, taking a gift to new neighbors, or paying the bus fare for another passenger.

HISTORICAL MINUTES

02-27-1989

Town Council considered an environmental health ordinance. The ordinance was favored by all members of Council and was approved for adoption.

02-26-1996

Town Council discussed and voted on a fee ordinance for overweight vehicles on Town roads with weight limits. This was passed unanimously by Council.

02-13-2006

Town Council considered and re-adopted Resolution #2002-0703-01. The resolution is as follows: "a comment to the maintenance of the Town's unique character and rural atmosphere through the retention of the historic one acre residential lot size". This readoption was passed unanimously by Council.

02-17-2014

Town Council considered and unanimously approved an ordinance prohibiting the sale, use, and possession of e-cigarettes to minors.
